Speaker: **Bruce Lyon**, Professor of Ecology and Evolutionary Biology, UCSC

Reconsider the coot: the crazy reproductive antics of a common marsh denizen

Bruce Lyon is Professor of Ecology and Evolutionary Biology at UC Santa Cruz. He has had a distinguished career investigating the social behavior of animals, with a focus on the reproductive strategies of birds. By studying bird populations in North and South America he has greatly advanced our understanding of "brood parasitism" the phenomenon in which one bird lays its eggs in the nest of another bird. He is also an excellent teacher and photographer.

ASB PROJECT OFF TO A ROUSING START!

Our OLLI ASB efforts were kicked off at our General Meeting on Feb 19. OLLI members arrived with armloads of clothing for the Farmworker Flea Market that will be held on March 26 in Watsonville. It took two full carloads to get it all to Mary Caravalho's house. Mary and I described to the audience the four ways OLLI members can participate in the ASB. A highlight was Mary's Diaper Bag. Farmworker families had indicated they had a special need for diapers. They are expensive, and these days, a diaper gets only one use. OLLI members filled the diaper bag. A total of over \$700 was collected.

We will be accepting Diaper Fund donations and Flea Market contributions until the end of our next OLLI General meeting on March 19. OLLI folks can drop off items in the interim in the large box on the porch of Mary Caravalho's house. The address is 129 Los Altos Court, Westside Santa Cruz (95060). Diaper Fund donations can also be sent to Mary. Checks should be made out to "UC Regents" and "ASB Diaper Fund" should appear on the memo line.

Items requested for the flea market are clothing, of course, as well as small working appliances (microwaves, lamps, toasters, etc.), household items (paper towels, TP, soap, shampoo, etc) and children's books in English.

Our OLLI ASB team attended the first joint ASB meeting on Saturday February 25. What a warm welcome we received from the 25 ASB students! Ashley Perez and Melissa Rivera, the student facilitators, led us through a series of activities. Before long we

Following the panel, there were lively Q&A sessions and we came away with a deeper understanding of the vibrant Watsonville community.

It's thrilling to be working closely with these exceptional people. Melissa and Ashley are terrific leaders. They are supported by Abbey Asher, the Service Learning Coordinator and Flora Lu, Colleges Nine and Ten Provost. We are happily looking forward to the next ASB event on March 26, when we'll meet together with our student partners at the Digital Nest in Watsonville. And, because the students wanted to know more about OLLI, we've invited the ASB students to attend our March 19th General Meeting, so other OLLI members can get a chance to chat with them.

PRESIDENT'S CORNER

OLLI courses are open to OLLI members only. Consequently, it is a good reason to join OLLI after the first of June as it will enable you to sign-up for courses when



the curriculum becomes available. Courses start in September or October. You must be a member to sign up online. Non-members will not be able to access the course signup page.

If you mail in your course registration check, it will be held until your OLLI membership is verified. We will inform you we are holding your check, subject to membership confirmation. If in the interim you decide not to join OLLI the check will be destroyed.

A list will be prepared for OLLI members registered for each course and attendees will be checked off the list on the first day of the course. Late registrations will be added to the check-off list. OLLI members wishing to sign-up at the door, on the day of the course, may do so, only if they can be accommodated in the classroom. The OLLI member will need to provide the registration donation (checks only). Similarly, providing they can be accommodated in the class room, non-OLLI members wishing to sign up for a class at the door may do so. They will need to provide a donation check for class attendance and in addition, a donation check for OLLI membership.

On the first day, to expedite entry into the course, OLLI members should bring their course registration acknowledgement with them. We may at some future date send out validation tickets for class attendance.

Note: Donations for OLLI membership and class attendance are used to provide OLLI scholarships for "Transfer and Re-entry Students".

1711 - Shakespeare


February 28, March 7, 14, 21 10 am - 12 pm

Location: Museum of Art and His-

torv

Instructor: Michael Warren

We are fortunate to again have Prof. Michael Warren, a very knowledgeable and vastly entertaining Shakespeare scholar, presenting a course for us.



His courses for OLLI for the previous six years have been enthusiastically praised by our members.

The four lectures will be devoted to the plays of the 2017 Santa Cruz Shakespeare season: The Two Gentlemen of Verona and Measure for Measure. Two Gentlemen is one of the earliest of the Shakespeare plays, a lively comedy of male friendship, young love, and betrayal. Measure for Measure is a great play that is performed too rarely. Written around the same time as Othello, it is a comedy both deeply serious and very funny, an unromantic exploration of sexual desire, law, justice, and mercy in a tough urban setting.

We will devote the first meeting and half the second to Two Gentlemen; the remaining hours will be devoted to Measure for Measure. Members of the course should read the first four acts of Two Gentlemen for the first class.

Michael Warren is Emeritus Professor of English Literature at UCSC. He serves as Textual Consultant and dramaturge for Santa Cruz Shakespeare. He is a past president of the Shakespeare Association of America.

OLLI's special relationship with Maestro Michel Singher and his ensemble – Espressivo – A Small Intense Orchestra – will continue this Spring. Our members have been thrilled with the three Espressivo concerts and with the three courses Maestro Singher offered to OLLI members.



In this course Michel Singher will introduce the Espressivo orchestra concert of March 30th—"An American Heritage." He will elucidate a work each by Charles Ives, Ned Rorem and Aaron Copland. In an additional talk, he will give an insider's view of what a conductor does.






is happening today. Ronnie has been very generous in sharing her knowledge with OLLI members, and her past courses have been exceedingly well attended.

It Can Be Done! With a Little Patience You Too Can Register Online

Last week when a prospective new member phoned me to find out how to join and register for a class I recommended using our online service. Mailed in applications go through the US Postal Service and then to UCSC's post office before being sorted and forwarded to our office at STARS. That takes time. Joining, renewing, or signing up for a course using our online process can be far speedier. HOWEVER, before you can proceed to conduct your business with OLLI for the first time you need to register with the university from our website: olli.ucsc.edu A return email from UCSC will give you your IDENTITY CODE, permitting you to complete any transactions you care to conduct — join, renew or sign up for classes. Last week in the span of 24 hours a new member joined and signed up for a class!

I can't promise everybody it will be that easy because there can be short delays at the university, but online registration really is the way to go. BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR JUNK EMAIL, OR SPAM INBOX FOR THE REPLY FROM THE UNIVERSITY GIVING YOU YOUR AUTHORIZATION CODE if it doesn't show up in your regular inbox, because it lands there frequently! You may not receive a reply the same day. We aren't like the commercial websites that provide almost instantaneous turn around service.
