MINUTES OF BOARD MEETING JANUARY 12, 2012

Minutes of the November 17, 2011 were approved as corrected.

President's Report: Chris LeMaistre

Chris opened the meeting at 10 a.m. at the home of Inga Hoffman.

- 1. Chris reported that the OLLI National Conference in November should be attended by some of us. We need to nominate two people to go.** Harry Hanson expressed an interest in attending the national meeting. Programs at the conference were described by Chris.
