President's Comments: Chris Le Maistre

1. Fred has contacted many individuals and has had a better response for spring programs. He does have Ron Duncan of the Soquel Water District for October. He will speak about water demand in the County and desalination.

2. Fred reported Nichole Paiement has cancelled her April talk due to conflict with rehearsals.

3. Fred has John Jordan of the Dickens Project for November and for January Professor Charles Hedrick on Greek and Roman History. He has talked with Bruce Daniels of MIT. He will have Professor Michael Mateas in the spring. The Director of Women studies Lizbeth Haas and Dr. James Hines, a research oceanographer are also possibilities.

We will review later and not implement until February of next year.
