- 6. Fred introduced Matt Miller who has agreed to serve as the Interest Group Coordinator since Phyllis Wood has resigned from the position.

Subcommittee Reports:

1. Parking: Dennis Morris

2. Online Transactions: Mark Gordon

- 7. Health Care Systems local, national and international.
- 8. New Yorker Cover and Cartoons the nature of humor.

It was unanimously approved to invite Florence Orenstein to the next Board meeting to discuss the "Ears in Action" proposal to assist UCSC students in listening to their papers and serving as a sounding board but not as a counseling service.

There will also be room at the tables at the meeting for other volunteer and service groups, such as mentoring foster parents and Planned Giving by University Relations.
